REMINDERS

PREPARATION

- Use 12.5-gallon trash bags.
- Limit of 2 bags of trash per night
- If you have more than one bag, place the second on top of the can, NOT on the floor.
- Please break down all boxes.
- When the bag gets full, TIE IT, and set the can outside your front door on pickup nights from 6–8PM.

COLLECTION

- Trash Fairies start their collection at 8PM.
- Collection days are **Sunday–Thursday**.
- NO collection on Friday or Saturday night
- NO oversized/overweight items, liquid, hazardous waste, or loose trash
- Do NOT put trash bags on the floor.

NEXT MORNING

- Bring your empty can inside by 9AM the next day.

TRASH CHUTE

- Ensure that you are placing your bags in the chutes and NOT on the floor in the trash room. You will be charged a \$50 removal fee if you leave trash on the floor.
- Do NOT put boxes in the trash chute: break them down and place them outside of the trash room on the 1st floor.

The Stars and Stripes

Flying outside businesses and homes, in classrooms and on TV, the American flag is seen by many of us every day. Each year on June 14, Flag Day is an opportunity for us to appreciate this patriotic symbol and all it stands for. The holiday marks the date in 1777 when the Second Continental Congress adopted the nation's first flag, which had 13 red and white stripes and 13 white stars on a blue field in the upper left corner. The number of stars and stripes represented the 13 Colonies that formed the U.S. Today's flag continues to honor the original Colonies by keeping the 13 stripes, but there are now 50 stars in the corner, as the country has grown to include 50 states.

What Makes a Federal Holiday?

June is full of fun and festivities, from Father’s Day to Flag Day to Juneteenth—but only one of these is a federal holiday. Juneteenth is the country’s most recent federal holiday, added in 2021. So how does an observance become a federal holiday?

Federal holidays are introduced and voted on by Congress, and if a proposed holiday is approved by both the House of Representatives and the Senate, then it’s sent to the president to sign into legislation. The first federal holidays were created in June 1870: New Year’s Day, Independence Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. Typically, holidays are deemed worthy of federal recognition if they are already celebrated in many states.

Members of Congress can propose holidays to be recognized as federal. Some recent suggestions have included Election Day and Indigenous Peoples’ Day.

You may notice that several federal holidays shift dates every year. That’s because of the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which was passed in 1968 to create three-day weekends throughout the year. The long weekends are intended to make it easier for people to visit historic sites and gather for celebrations.

Most federal employees receive paid time off on federal holidays, and government offices are closed. This includes the post office, so mail is not delivered on these days. Many other businesses choose to close operations on federal holidays as well.

"This Month In History" JUNE

1916: "America's Sweetheart" Mary Pickford signs a contract with producer Adolph Zukor that guarantees a \$1 million salary over two years. The silent film star was the first actress to sign a million-dollar contract.

1927: The Peace Bridge opens. Crossing the Niagara River, the international bridge connects Buffalo, N.Y., to Fort Erie, Ontario.

1948: The borders of Berlin, Germany, are blockaded, cutting off access to electricity, food, medicine and

other supplies to around 2.5 million civilians. Two days later, on June 26, U.S. and British planes began dropping in supplies for aid, a mission known as the Berlin Airlift.

1953: Queen Elizabeth II is crowned as queen of the United Kingdom. Her 70-year reign, which ended in 2022, was the longest of any British monarch.

1973: Horse Secretariat becomes the first Triple Crown winner in 25 years. Earning the crown after winning the Kentucky Derby, Preakness Stakes and Belmont Stakes, Secretariat still holds time records in all three races.

1989: "Batman," the first big-budget movie about the superhero, premieres. Starring Michael Keaton, the film won an Oscar in 1990 for best art direction.

1991: The video game Sonic the Hedgehog debuts. Praised as one of the greatest games ever, the franchise is still going strong today.
